
Family Ties: Heartwarming Tales and Treasured Memories!

Shyam Sunder



Our Pongal celebrations are a beautiful reflection of our heritage and unity as a family. We wake up before dawn to prepare the traditional Pongal dish, filling our home with its delicious aroma.

New dresses, cleaned, painted, and decorated homes, colorful (Kolam) rangolis, pujas and celebrations, well-bred cattle, delicious dishes, blessings of elders, rewarding the workforce, gifts, dresses, and sweets to near and dear ones, cultural competitions, Jallikattu (sport of controlling the bulls), field trips, and temple visits.

We celebrate Pongal for 4 days.

Day 1 - Bhogi Pongal - A joyful atmosphere created by painting, decorating, and cleaning your home during Bhogi Pongal.

Day 2 - Surya Pongal - An earthen/Brass Pongal pot cooked in front of the sun is Surya Pongal.

Day 3 - Mattu Pongal - Mattu means "cow, bullock, cattle," and cattle are significant to Tamil Hindus. As part of Mattu Pongal, cows are decked with flower garlands, received bananas, and worshipped. And there are also games and races like Jallikattu, an annual cow race.

Day 4 - Kanum Pongal - Families get together to reunite.

Sharing laughter, stories, and traditional games, we rejoice in the blessings of abundance and togetherness. It's a time when our bonds grow deeper, and the spirit of unity and tradition fills our hearts with warmth and joy.




